**VE Day recollections** - Several members of our congregation have shared their memories of where they were and what they were doing on 7-8th May 1943.

**Phyllis Ward** was in the nurses' home in Wallasey. Their home was the only building still standing in Church Street after the bombing. **Eileen Whittle's** abiding memory was that she had got out of her Latin homework! **Nevil Newman** set off with two friends on their bikes to go rock climbing on Great Almscliffe Crags between Harewood and Harrogate on the extra day off school. **Joyce** was at Evensong at Casterton school when the Headmistress announced the war in Europe was over. "The hall erupted with joy, we certainly made a noise. The hymn previously chosen for the service was "O God our help in ages past" - very appropriate. We sang it with joy as loudly as we could, and really raised the roof. Everyone was smiling; some were crying as well. It is a vivid memory and something I will never forget'. **Mollie Bell** was at school in Epsom; she remembers her headmistress making the announcement and telling the girls they all had the next day off. **Pat Rye** remembers going to her tennis club to celebrate.
