**But a word from the Revd David Wilmot**

The Lord be with you. The great thing about following a pattern of readings (what we call a lectionary) is that firstly, it prevents you from only going to passages that you 'like' - so it stretches you a bit and secondly you find yourself surprised, comforted and sometimes deeply touched by the word which comes, as it were, personally to you and your circumstances. This morning I was pitched into Psalm 27. What touched me were the following: 'The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid? (v1) "In the day of trouble he shall hide me in his shelter; in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me and set me high upon a rock"(v6) "Wait for the Lord; be strong and he shall comfort your heart; wait patiently for the Lord" (v17) Enough said. A message from Amiel, support minister for St Mary's 'Safe worship' services are now well established back at St Mary's. Though on reflection, is worship ever 'safe', when we worship the living God who is Creator of the universe?! One of my favourite books is still CS Lewis' 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe', with Aslan as the Christ-figure. I remember Susan's words, "If Aslan is a lion, King of Beasts, is he quite safe?" "Safe?" said Mr Beaver. "Who said anything about safe? Course he isn't safe. But he's good. He's the King, I tell you!" "I'm longing to see him" said Peter, "even if I do feel frightened when it comes to the point"..... The old King James version of the Bible speaks of 'fearing God', in the sense of awe and wonder. We must beware of the human tendency to domesticate God, to shrink him in our imaginations down to our own size, to make us feel 'safe'. We are secure in God's hands, but that's not because he is safe, predictable and controllable. It's because he is utterly 'good' and he loves us.
