Hopefully you will have received the notification that the PCC has taken the decision to close both our churches. Although the Government sanctioned communal worship within the strict guidelines, we felt that, given the age of our congregations, it would be unwise to open our doors. So, whilst as a church we could legally meet, we have regrettably decided that for the sake of our community that we shouldn't. The weekly phone calls will begin again to keep us in touch with one another and to pass on items of news to those without internet access, and the pewsheets, readings and suggested form of worship from the Team Rector will continue to be emailed. They will also be available on the web site. The situation will be reviewed on the 21st January.

All the churches in the Team are closed, except Finsthwaite and Field Broughton; Flookburgh is open for private prayer on Wednesdays 10.30-noon, and Friday 2-3.30 pm.
