
Dreaming The Impossible



In August, Soul Fuel members joined a Cumbria wide Network Youth Church trip to Dreaming The Impossible, a camp organised by Vineyard Church that seeks to inspire young people to follow Jesus. The young people had an "absolute blast" with camping, lots of food, worship, bible teaching, foam parties, colour runs and plenty of time to make new friends. The trip would never have happened without the dedication of committed volunteer cooks, youth leaders and practical people who helped to set up camp.

It is fair to say the young people from Soul Fuel had never experienced anything like DTI and one young person called their time at the event 'indescribable'. A number of young people, including some from Soul Fuel, decided they wanted to take their relationship

with Jesus more seriously and took the opportunity to go to the front to be prayed for.





Prayer Space



The week beginning 7th July, Chris led the annual Prayer Space at Cartmel Priory School. A massive thanks goes to the team of volunteers from a wide spread of churches from across the Peninsula and beyond. Almost 300 young people passed through the space where they were encouraged to think about themes based on the Beatitudes. Stations included the scales of justice, where

they were encouraged to think about injustice in the world and how we can balance the scales, a Resilience graffiti wall where young people were encouraged to think about how God gives us resilience and hope, and that there are also other people and things that encourage us as we live our lives. There was a table of joy, with an opportunity to draw, paint or sketch a picture of something participants where thankful for. It was recognised that often joy can be messy which is

symbolised by the messy table above. Young people were reminded that God has the whole world in his hands and were invited to draw around their hand, cut it out and to use it to pray for an issue. One of the more reflective stations was forgiveness, where young people wrote the word sorry on a piece of paper using a soluble pen and could watch the word fade away when dipped in water, symbolic of Jesus' forgiveness for us.




Year 6 Moving On
